BUCKINGHAM-PALACE, July 17, 1854.

THIS day had audience of the Queen;—
The Count Von Bernstorff, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Prussia, to present his credentials to Her Majesty :

To which audience he was introduced by the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Major-General the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K.C.H., Her Majesty's Master of the Ceremonies.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Humphrey Harper Burchell, of Bushey Grange, in the parish of Bushey, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace, and one of the Deputy Lieutenants for the said county, Her royal licence and authority that he and his issue may henceforth take and use the surname of Herne, in addition to and after that of Burchell :

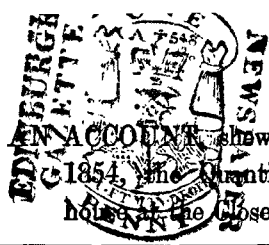
