BUCKINGHAM-PALACE, July 17, 1854.

THIS day had audience of the Queen; The Count Von Bernstorff, Envoy Extraor-dinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Prussia, to present his credentials to Her

To which audience he was introduced by the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Major-General the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K.C.H., Her Majesty's Master of the Ceremonies.

WHITEHALL, July 17, 1854.
