**PALACE OF HOLYROOD,**

14th September 1854.

**T**HIS Evening, at Fifteen Minutes to Seven o'Clock, Her Most Gracious Majesty **THE QUEEN**, accompanied by His Royal Highness **THE PRINCE ALBERT**, and Their Royal Highnesses **THE PRINCE OF WALES**, **THE PRINCESS-ROYAL**, **PRINCESS ALICE**, **PRINCE ALFRED**, and **THE PRINCESS HELENA**, and Suite, arrived at Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood.

On Her Majesty's arrival a Royal Salute was fired from the Guns of the Castle.

**PALACE OF HOLYROOD,**

15th September 1854.

This Morning, at a Quarter to Nine o'Clock, Her Most Gracious Majesty **THE QUEEN**, accompanied by His Royal Highness **THE PRINCE ALBERT**, and Their Royal Highnesses **THE PRINCE OF WALES**, **THE PRINCESS-ROYAL**, **PRINCESS ALICE**, **PRINCE ALFRED**, and **THE PRINCESS HELENA**, and Suite, took their Departure from Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood for Balmoral, under a Salute from the Guns of the Castle.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the tenth year of Her present Majesty for the more speedy removal of certain nuisances and the prevention of contagious and epidemic diseases," after reciting that it is expedient that when any part of the United Kingdom shall appear to be threatened with, or affected by any formidable epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, measures of precaution should be taken with promptitude, according to the exigency of the case; it is enacted that in Great Britain the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them (the Lord President of the Council, or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State being one), may, by Order or Orders to be by them from time to time made, direct that the provisions in the said Act contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force in Great Britain, or in such parts thereof, or in such places therein, respectively, as in such Order or Orders respectively may be expressed, and may, from time to time, as to all or any of the parts or places to which any such Order or Orders may extend, and in like manner, revoke or renew any such Order; and, subject to revocation and renewal as aforesaid, every such Order shall be in force for six calendar months, or for such shorter period as in such Order shall be expressed.

And whereas, on the fifteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, an Order was made by the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, reciting that the United Kingdom appeared to be threatened with a formidable epidemic disease, and that a case had arisen for putting in force the provisions of the said Act, and directing, in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in them as aforesaid, that the provisions contained in the said hereinbefore recited Act, for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain immediately from and after the date of the said Order; and it was further directed

that the said Order should continue in force for six calendar months from and after the date thereof.

And whereas, on the tenth day of March last, such Order was renewed for a period of six calendar months from the said tenth day of March ;

And whereas certain parts of the United Kingdom are affected by a formidable epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, and it is expedient that the said Order be again renewed : Now, therefore, it is hereby directed by the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (of whom the Right Honourable Viscount Palmerston, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State is one), in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in them as aforesaid, that the said Order of the fifteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three be, and the same is hereby renewed for a period of six calendar months from and after the date of this present Order.

### GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

*Renewal Order. (Scotland.) September 1854.*

To the Parochial Boards of the several Parishes and Combinations throughout Scotland ;

To all Magistrates of Burghs ; Town Councils ; Commissioners of Police ; Trustees or Commissioners having the charge of the Paving of Streets ; Trustees having the charge of Turnpike Roads and other Highways ; Trustees or Commissioners having the charge of Docks, Ports, or Harbours ; Inspectors, Surveyors, or other Officers acting under such Magistrates, Town-Councils, Commissioners, and Trustees ; and all other Persons intrusted by law with the care and management of the Streets, and Public Ways and Places throughout Scotland ;

To the Procurators Fiscal, and other Persons authorized to conduct Prosecutions before the Local Courts in Scotland ;

To the Owners and Occupiers of Houses, Dwellings, Churches, Buildings, and Places of Assembly, and others having the care and ordering thereof, throughout Scotland ;

And to all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the " Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, and by virtue of an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 15th day of September 1853, directing that the said provisions of the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, the General Board of Health are authorized to issue such Directions and Regulations as the said Board shall think fit, for the prevention (as far as possible) or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases : And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the Directions and Regulations to be issued as aforesaid shall extend to all parts or places in which the said provisions of the said Act shall, for the time being, be in force, under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council ; unless such Directions or Regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such Directions and Regulations shall be specified :

And whereas the said General Board did, under the authority of the said Order, issue certain

Directions and Regulations, bearing date respectively the 24th and the 29th days of September, and the 18th day of October 1853, to extend to Scotland, and be in force throughout that part of the United Kingdom :

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 10th day of March 1854, the said first-mentioned Order was renewed for a further period of six calendar months thence next ensuing :

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council bearing date the 7th day of September 1854, the said Order was renewed for a further period of six calendar months from and after the said 7th day of September 1854, the date of such renewed Order in Council :

Now, therefore, the said General Board of Health does hereby renew the said Directions and Regulations of the 24th and 29th days of September respectively, and of the 18th day of October 1853, to extend to Scotland, and to be in force throughout that part of the United Kingdom for such time as the said renewed Order shall continue in force.
