NOTICE TO MARINERS.

INSTEAD of the temporary Lightship which was placed on the Copperground off Læso Island on the 24th September last year, a Light-ship with three masts, a stronger light on each mast, and a ball on each mast head, will be placed on that shoal about the end of next month.

The Light on the fore and mainmost mast will be shown 28 feet, and that on the midship 40 feet, above the level of the water.

This Preliminary Notice is hereby given, and further particulars will be made public when the new Light-ship shows her light for the first time.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

HEREWITH is made known, that in the Island of Hekkingen, at the entrance of the channel leading to Tromsøe, through the Malangen Fiord, is erected a day mark, in the form of a wall, the breadth of which at the base is 24 feet, and at the top 16 feet, and the height 32 feet.

The mark is painted of a light colour, and exhibits its greatest front directly towards the in-sailing, or in a N. W. direction according to true compass.

Long. east of Greenwich, 17° 51' 0"; lat. N. 69° 36' 0"; height above high water, 300 Norwegian feet, and visible 8 to 12 miles.
