

**3. Anatomy and Physiology, including Comparative Anatomy.**

**4. Natural History, including Botany and Zoology.**

The Examination will be conducted—

1. By means of written Questions and Answers.
2. By object examinations and experiments, when the subject admits of such tests.
3. By practical examination at the bedside of the Patient, and by dissections and operations on the dead body.
4. By *visu voce* examination.

The persons who shall be pronounced by the Examiners to be the best qualified in all respects, shall be appointed to fill the requisite number of appointments as Assistant-Surgeons in the East India Company's Service.

All Assistant-Surgeons are required to subscribe to the Military or Medical, and Medical-retiring Funds, at the Presidencies to which they may be respectively appointed, and to the Military Orphan Society also, if appointed to Bengal.

All Assistant-Surgeons who shall neglect or refuse to proceed to India under the orders of the Court of Directors, within three months from the date of their appointments, will be considered as having forfeited them, unless special circumstances shall justify a departure from this Regulation.

Candidates may apply to Dr Scott, 13, Stratton Street, for further information, if needed.

*N.B.*—The Certificates and Notices as to Examination herein contained, apply only to the Examination to be held in January next.

Regulations regarding the requirements of Candidates for future Examinations will be issued after the first Examination.

*NOTE, October 4, 1854.*—Candidates who may not have been able to attend the practice of an Asylum for the Insane or of an Ophthalmic Hospital for three months previous to offering themselves for examination in January 1855, will not be excluded from examination, but will, if successful in obtaining recommendation for appointments, be required to produce Certificates of having attended such practice during the interval between the Examination and the time of proceeding to India.

The Board of Examiners of Candidates for the appointments of Assistant-Surgeons in the East India Company's Service give notice, that on the 8th January 1855, they will hold Examinations at the East India House for the selection of Assistant-Surgeons. The selection will be made according to merit, and it is expected that about thirty appointments will be awarded.

**INTIMATION is Hereby Given, in terms of an Interlocutor by the Lords of Council and Session, Commissioners for the Plantation of Kirks and Valuation of Teinds, dated the 12th day of July 1854, and pursuant to the Statute, 7th and 8th Vict., chapter 44, that a Petition has been presented to their Lordships, for and in name of the Reverend JAMES ROBERTSON, D.D., Convener, and on behalf of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland's Committee on the Endowment of Chapels of Ease, and Others, contributors to the Endowment of the proposed NEW CHURCH and PARISH of NEWARK, in the Parishes of Port-Glasgow and Greenock; and Presbytery of Greenock, praying their Lordships, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Acts of Parliament therein recited, to DISJOIN and ERASE the said Church of Newark into a PARISH CHURCH in connection with the Church of Scotland, and to MARK out and DESIGNATE the District last specially set forth in the said Petition, consisting of portions of the Parishes of Port-Glasgow and Greenock, or such other District as their Lordships should see fit as the District to be attached to the said Church of Newark *quoad sacra*, and to DISJOIN such District *quoad sacra* from the Parishes of Port-Glasgow and Greenock, to which the same now belongs, and to ERASE such District into a Parish *quoad sacra* in connection with the Church of Scotland, to be called THE CHURCH and PARISH of NEWARK, Port-Glasgow; and to Find and Declare that the Minister and Elders of the said Church and Parish so to be erected shall have and enjoy the status, and all the powers, rights, and privileges of a Parish Minister and Elders of the Church of Scotland; and to Find and Declare that upon the said**

**Church of Newark, and District to be attached thereto, being erected into a Church and Parish *quoad sacra*, in terms of the foregoing cravings, the Patronage thereof shall be thereafter vested in the parties pointed out by the Eighth Article of the Constitution, recited in the said Petition, granted to the said Church by the General Assembly of the said Church of Scotland on the 29th day of May 1854, but always under the reservation of the right of the Presbytery of the Bounds to present to the said Church, *juxta devoluto*, according to law, and as provided in the said Act of the 7th and 8th Victoria, chapter 44; and to Find, Decern, and Declare in the premises, in terms of the foregoing cravings, or in such other terms as to their Lordships shall seem meet, as the said Petition in itself more fully bears; and intimation is hereby further given that, agreeably to the appointment in said Interlocutor, the Petitioners have lodged printed copies of the said Petition with the Session-Clerks of the Parish of Port-Glasgow, and of the said Church or Chapel of Newark, for the use of such parties interested as may apply for them.**
