WHITEHALL, January 10, 1855.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Richard Fellowes, of Englefield House, in the county of Berks, Esquire, in the commission of the Peace for the said county, third but second surviving son of William Henry Fellowes, late of Ramsey Abbey, in the county of Huntingdon, Esquire, by Emma his wife, fourth daughter of Richard Benyon, sometime of Gidea Hall, in the county of Essex, and afterwards of Englefield House aforesaid, Esquire, and sister and co-heir of Richard Benyon de Beauvoir, late also of Englefield House, Esquire, all deceased, Her royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in a settlement made pursuant to the last will and testament of his said maternal uncle, Richard Benyon de Beauvoir (formerly Richard Benyon), take and henceforth use the surname of Benyon only, instead of that of Fellowes, and that he and they may bear the arms of Benyon quarterly with his and their own family arms, such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect :

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
