WILLIAM ALEXANDER ANTHONY ARCHIBALD,  
DUKE OF HAMILTON, BRANDON, and CHATELHER-  
AULT, Heir of Entail in possession of the Duke-  
dom and Estate of HAMILTON, has presented a Peti-  
tion to the Court of Session (First Division, Mr  
Walker, Clerk,) in terms of the Act 11 and 12  
Victoria, chapter 36, intituled 'An Act for the

chapter 94, intituled 'An Act to extend the benefit

approve of and interpose their authority to a Con-  
tract of Excambion, bearing date 18th and 23d

in exchange for the Main Coal, consisting of three  
hundred and twenty-eight acres, and ten one-hun-  
dredth parts of an acre, and part of the Coxroad  
Coal, consisting of twenty-two acres and six hun-

acre, Imperial measure, therein described, forming
