30th Foot—1 Officer (Lieutenant-Colonel Patullo), 12 men killed; 5 Officers (Captains Pocock and Stevenson, since dead, Lieutenant Kerr, and Ensign Deane, since dead), 12 men dangerously, 2 Officers (Lieutenants Field and Saunders), 49 men severely, 3 Officers (Lieutenant-Colonel Mauleverer, Brevet-Major Campbell, Lieutenant Austin, and Ensign Moorsom), 40 men slightly, wounded; total killed, 1 Officer, 12 men; wounded, 10 Officers, 101 men.

41st Foot—2 Officers (Captains Lockhart and Every), 2 men killed; 1 Officer (Lieutenant-Colonel Eman, C.B.), 6 men dangerously, 1 Officer (Lieutenant Kingscote), 47 men severely, 4 Officers (Major Pratt, Captain Rowlands, Lieutenants Maude and Hamilton), 58 men slightly wounded; total killed, 2 Officers, 2 men; wounded, 6 Officers, 111 men.

47th Foot—3 men killed; 1 man dangerously, 6 men severely, 20 men slightly, wounded; total killed, 3 men; wounded, 27 men.

49th Foot—1 Officer (Captain Rochfort), 2 men killed; 1 Officer (Ensign Michell), 1 man dangerously, 1 Officer (Brevet-Major King), 9 men severely, 16 men slightly, wounded; total killed, 1 Officer, 2 men; wounded, 2 Officers, 26 men.

55th Foot—1 Officer (Brevet-Lieutenant-Colonel Cuddy) killed; 7 men dangerously, 4 Officers (Major Cure, Captains R. Hume and J. Hume, and Lieutenant Johnston), 47 men severely, 1 Officer (Captain Richards), 51 men slightly, wounded; total killed, 1 Officer; wounded, 5 Officers, 105 men.

62d Foot—3 Officers (Captains Cox and Blakes-ton), killed; 5 men, dangerously, 2 Officers (Lieutenant-Colonel Tyler and Major Daubeney), 25 men severely, 3 Officers (Captain Hunter, Lieutenants Diring and Davenport), 37 men, slightly wounded; total killed, 3 Officers; wounded, 5 Officers, 67 men.

95th Foot—2 Officers (Captain Serjeant and Lieutenant Packinton, slight contusions), 3 men, slightly wounded; total wounded, 2 Officers, 3 men,

Scots Fusilier Guards—1 man slightly wounded.
