I avail myself of this opportunity to bring before you the name of Lieutenant-Colonel d'Etat-Major de Suslean, who succeeded the late Lieutenant-Colonel Vico at my Head-Quarters.

He is unremitting in his attention, and performs all the duties I have required of him with a zeal, intelligence, and cheerfulness that merit my warmest thanks.

MONSIEUR LE MARECHAL,

J'AI déjà eu l'occasion ainsi que mes prédécesseurs de recourir à votre bienveillante intervention pour faire ressortir auprès du Gouvernement Britannique les services incessants et fort utiles que n'ont cessé de rendre depuis le commencement de cette guerre, M.M. le Major-Général Hugh Rose et le Lieutenant-Colonel S. Georges Foley, tous deux Commissaires de S. M. la Reine auprès du Quartier-Général Français.

Dans les journées des 7 et 18 Juin, du 16 Août, et notamment le 8 Septembre, ces deux Officiers se sont multipliés pour maintenir en communication verbale et constante les deux Armées ; et dans ce but, ils ont eu souvent à remplir les missions les plus périlleuses.

Je n'ai pas besoin de dire ici comment ils se sont acquittés de ces devoirs militaires, ce serait superflu.

La prise de Sébastopol est une circonstance trop heureuse, pour que je ne vous prie pas de nouveau, de faire parvenir au Gouvernement Anglais, l'expression de mon estime envers ces deux Officiers, et de mon désir de les voir obtenir l'un et l'autre les récompenses qu'ils ont si dignement méritées.

EMBARKATION OF NAVAL BRIGADE.

*Royal Albert, off Sevastopol,  
September 18, 1855.*

GENERAL ORDER.

*Head-Quarters, Sevastopol,  
September 17, 1855.*

No. 1. The service for which the Naval Brigade was attached to this Army having been completed by the fall of Sevastopol, the Force has been ordered to rejoin the Fleet.

The Commander of the Forces heartily thanks the Officers, Petty Officers, and Seamen, for the very efficient services they have rendered in the batteries, and on all occasions when their aid against the enemy was required; and he has to notice the patience and courage with which, side by side with the Soldiers of this Army, they have endured the dangers and hardships of nearly a year's duty in the trenches.

General Simpson cordially acknowledges the obligations he is under to Rear-Admiral Sir Stephen Lushington, K.C.B., who so ably commanded the Brigade from its formation until his removal, by promotion, to a higher rank, and to Captain Honourable H. Keppel, R.N., who succeeded him, and retained the command until the conclusion of this ever-memorable siege.

NOTICE.

(Copy.)

*Relating to the lighting of a Channel Lighthouse, on Staværnspoint (Staværns-sodden.)*

ON Staværnspoint, on the eastern side of the southern channel into Frederickveern a fixed channel light will be lighted on the 1st of next October, and kept lighted from the 15th July all through the winter, until the morning of the 1st June. The period of burning, the same as the other lights in the kingdom, viz.—from the 21st September to the 20th March half an hour after sunset until sunrise, and from the 15th July to

the 20th September one hour after sunset until sunrise. Its north latitude  $58^{\circ} 59\frac{1}{2}'$ , longitude east of Greenwich  $10^{\circ} 4\frac{1}{2}'$ , and it is visible at a distance of 2 Norwegian or 8 English miles.

The light is visible from N. to E. through north to N.N.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. by compass, so that by keeping within the circumference of its light you clear "Rakkeboorne" on the west, and "Svinoørskaten" on the east side. From east it shines from W.N.W. to S.W. to W., in which light circumference by sailing in the south of the channel you are clear on the north of the "Fladen" reefs inside Svinoørskaten. On the other hand, the Rouoers Reefs, as well as the coast, and shoals and reefs lying off the same, on the north side of the channel, lie at an angle with the light, consequently cannot serve as a guide either for the north side of the channel or so far east as the Rouoerne.

*Relating to the lighting of the Light on the coast of Hellis Island (Hellissen).*

NOTICE is hereby given, that the new lighthouse on Hellis Island, on the southern side of Feye Island (Feye'oen), visible when sailing the northern channel into Bergen, will be lighted on the evening of the 15th of next October.

The light is a revolving one, showing every minute a strong flash of 12 seconds' duration. At a distance exceeding 8 English miles, an eclipse will be perceived between the flashes.

The light is visible all around, and burns throughout the year. It will be lighted in the evening and extinguished in the morning at the same time as the other lighthouses in the kingdom.

Its longitude east of Greenwich is  $4^{\circ} 43' 5''$ , its north latitude  $60^{\circ} 45' 0''$ .

Its altitude above the sea level about 165 feet; and is visible at the distance of 18 to 20 English miles.
