The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing copy of a French Imperial Decree, regulating as follows the duties upon sugars imported from the French Colonies:—

Of the first and inferior samples-

From beyond the Cape of Good Hope, 42 francs. From America, 45 francs.

Superior to first sample, per 100 kilos., 3 francs additional. Refined, per 100 kilos., 10 francs additional to duty on first sample.

For the present, however, these duties will be reduced in the following proportion :-

1st.—7 francs per 100 kilos., from 27th March 1856 to 30th June 1856. 2dly.—5 francs per 100 kilos., from 1st July 1858 to 30th June 1859. 3dly.—3 francs per 100 kilos., from 1st July 1859 to 30th June 1860.

The import duties paid upon sugars of a quality inferior or equal to the first sample will be returned upon the exportation of refined sugar in the following proportions for sugar imported directly in French Ships, from Countries out of Europe, upon the production of a receipt, of not more than four months date, of payment of the import duties :-
