PALACE OF HOLYROOD,

October 15, 1856.

THIS Evening, at Fifteen Minutes past Six o'Clock, Her Most Gracious Majesty THE QUEEN, accompanied by His Royal Highness The PRINCE ALBERT, and Their Royal Highnesses The PRINCESS ROYAL, The PRINCE ALFRED, The PRINCESS ALICE, The PRINCESS HELENA, and The PRINCESS LOUISA, and Suite, arrived at Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood, under a Salute from the Guns of the Castle.

PALACE OF HOLYROOD,

October 16, 1856.

This Morning, at Half-past Seven o'Clock, Her Most Gracious Majesty THE QUEEN, accompanied by His Royal Highness The PRINCE ALBERT, and Their Royal Highnesses The PRINCESS ROYAL, The PRINCE ALFRED, The PRINCESS ALICE, The PRINCESS HELENA, and The PRINCESS LOUISA, and Suite, took their departure from Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood *en route* for Windsor.

On Her Majesty's departure a Royal Salute was fired from the Guns of the Castle.

ADMIRALTY, October 14, 1856.

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received a Communication from the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, concerning a Despatch addressed to his Lordship by the Comte de Persigny, Ambassador at this Court from his Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, to the effect that a certain number of floats, bearing inscriptions to denote the place of their immersion, were thrown overboard during the recent expedition of his Imperial Highness Prince Napoleon to the North Sea, in the French frigate "La Reine Hortense," with a view to ascertain the direction of the currents in that sea. His Excellency desires that in the event of

any of these floats being cast upon the shores of Great Britain, the same may be transmitted to him without loss of time, at the French Embassy in London.

The Lords of the Admiralty, in making known the contents of this Despatch, request all persons finding any of the floats referred to, to forward them, with a statement of the time and place of their discovery, to

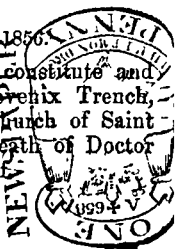
