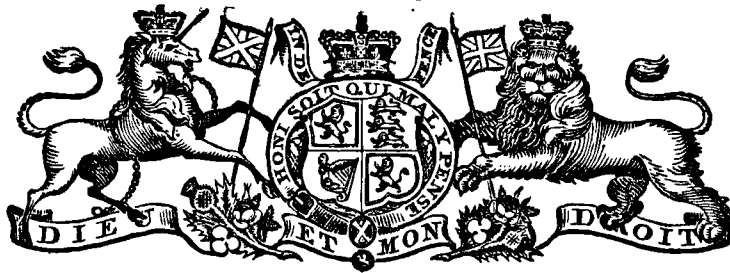

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at St Petersburg, inclosing copy of a notice which appeared in the Journal de Saint Pétersbourg, of the 1st of April, and of which the following is a translation.

Vessels arriving in Russian Baltic ports will no longer be required to produce acquittances of Sound duties or certificates of Danish quarantine previously to being allowed to enter.

Masters of vessels will be acquainted by notices, that henceforth they will be required to furnish themselves in the ports of lading with certificates, attesting the sanitary state of the country from which they come, which certificates must be attested by the Russian Consular Agent; or to procure certificates of quarantine in the English, French, Dutch, or Norwegian ports which they may have put into, these certificates being also required to be legally attested by a Russian Consular Agent.

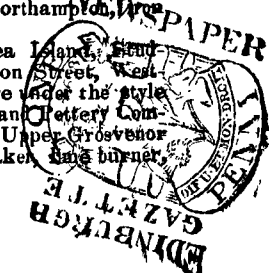
