Board of Trade, Whitehall, August 4, 1857.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Buenos Ayres, reporting the abolition of the tonnage dues hitherto levied upon Foreign vessels entering that port.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, August 4, 1857.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Madrid, fixing the duty upon cocoa nut and palm oils at 14 reals 85 cents per quintal, if imported under National, and 22 reals 85 cents per quintal if imported under Foreign flags.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Madrid, reporting the following alteration in the Spanish tariff:—

Gutta percha, gum elastic, quintawan, unmanufactured, 25 cents per lb. under National, and 35 cents under Foreign flags.

Ditto, out in strips or sheets, 2 reals 40 cents per lb. under National, 2 reals 50 cents under Foreign flags.

Ditto, manufactured into any forms or objects, whether vulcanized or not, and not included in other paragraphs of the tariff, 6 reals per lb. under National, and 6 reals 50 cents under Foreign flags.
