To The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

We, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Huntingdon, in Common Council assembled, approach the Throne with the strongest feelings of devoted attachment to your Majesty's Person and Family, offering our humble but sincere congratulations on the Marriage of the Princess Royal of England with His Royal Highness Prince Frederick William of Prussia.

Whilst participating with the deepest sympathy and unfeigned satisfaction in your Majesty's maternal feelings in the loss, as well as anxious hope for the welfare and happiness of a beloved daughter, we would feign trust that the auspicious event, bringing increased joy and happiness to our beloved Princess, will tend at the same time to cement more closely the friendly relations now existing between your Majesty's Kingdom and that of Prussia.
