AND A REWARD OF ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.

SOME NOTES having appeared, forged in imitation of the Five Shilling Notes of the Greenock Bank Company, dated the 2d December 1799, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS STERLING is hereby offered to any person who shall, within three months from this date, give such information, as that the Forgers, or those concerned with them in issuing, may be brought to justice, to be paid on conviction of the offender or offenders.

The Forged Notes are very ill executed, particularly on the device; the ornaments are faint, and badly done, the paper thin and dark coloured, and without any water-mark, which is attempted to be concealed, by pasting paper on the back of it. In short, from the whole appearance of these Notes, they are easily distinguished. All the real ones of the 2d December 1799 have the Government stamp on them for the duty, which the Forgery wants.
