**T**HE Queen has been pleased to approve of Don Juan Fair as Vice-Consul in London for the Argentine Republic.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes:"

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at St Petersburg, enclosing a copy of a Notification issued by the Russian Government, providing that articles of merchandize, other than effects intended for personal use, imported into Russia by persons not enjoying the rights of traders, will be subjected to the usual import duty

on such articles, augmented by one half, in default of which the articles may be re-exported.

The same Notification further makes known that, in the event of persons of the above class importing goods belonging to privileged merchants, and admissible at the ordinary rates of duty only, it will be necessary that such merchandize should be accompanied by the usual formal papers.

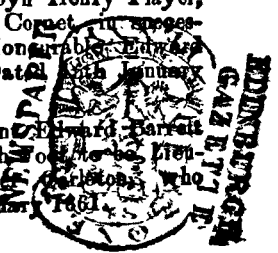

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 1.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—COAST OF EGYPT.  
Fixed Light at Port Said.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty that a light has recently been exhibited from a lighthouse at Port Said, 29 miles S.E. of the Damietta mouth of the Nile, coast of Egypt.

The light is a *fixed white* light, placed at an elevation of 66 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen from the deck of a ship at a distance of 9 miles in clear weather.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse is a skeleton tower of wood, and stands in lat. 31° 16' 0" N., long. 32° 19' 30" East from Greenwich.

The bearings are magnetic. Variation 6° 10' West, in 1861.

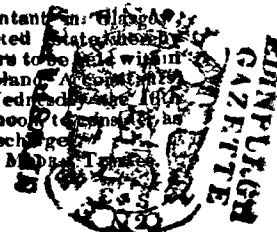
