THE Queen has been pleased to approve of Don Juan Fair as Vice-Cousul in London for the Argentine Republic.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twentyfourth year of the reign of His Majesty King
George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so
"much of two Acts made in the tenth and
"fifteenth years of the reign of His present
"Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House
"of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of
"the Crown for making out writs for the election
"of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner
"therein mentioned, and for substituting other
"provisions for the like purposes:"

Board of Trade, Whitchall, January 15, 1861.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at St Petersburgh, enclosing a copy of a Notification issued by the Russian Government, providing that articles of merchandize, other than effects intended for personal use, imported into Russia by persons not enjoying the rights of traders, will be subjected to the usual import duty

on such articles, augmented by one half, in default of which the articles may be re-exported.

The same Notification further makes known that, in the event of persons of the above class importing goods belonging to privileged merchants, and admissible at the ordinary rates of duty only, it will be necessary that such merchandize should be accompanied by the usual formal papers.
