NCLOSED I fend for their Lordships information a copy of my letter to Captain Cockburn, of La Minerve, relative to the capture of one of the enemy's privateers.

His Majesty's ship Flora, off Cape Finisterre, March 20, 1800.

I HAVE the pleasure to inform you, that after a chace of eight hours, I this day, at a quarter past 12 at noon, captured a Spanish ship privateer, of 16 guns (fix of which she hove overboard during the chace) men; proves to be the Corunesa, of and from Corunesa, of the corunesa of the corune na, 15 days, commanded by Robert Tortau; has captured during his cruize the brigs named at the bottom I am, Sir, &c.
