Copy of a Letter from Captain Middleton, Commander of his Majesty's ship *Flora*, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated off Cape Finisferre the 28th ult.

S I R,

ENCLOSED I send for their Lordships information a copy of my letter to Captain Cockburn, of *La Minerve*, relative to the capture of one of the enemy's privateers.

His Majesty's ship *Flora*, off Cape Finisferre, March 20, 1800.

S I R,

I HAVE the pleasure to inform you, that after a chase of eight hours, I, this day, at a quarter past 12 at noon, captured a Spanish ship privateer, of 16 guns (six of which she hove overboard during the chase) and ninety men; proves to be the *Corunefa*, of and from *Corunna*, 15 days, commanded by Robert Tortau; has captured during his cruize the brigs named at the bottom hereof.
