

BERWICKSHIRE RAILWAY.

(Incorporation of Company for Construction of Railway from the Hawick Branch of the North British Railway near Newtown, St Boswells, to Dunse; Working and other Arrangements with the North British Railway Company; Power to the North British Railway Company to Subscribe; Amendment of Acts; and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is Hereby Given, That a Bill is now pending in the Honourable the House of Commons, under the above short title, entitled "A Bill for making a Railway from the Hawick Branch of the North British Railway near Newtown, Saint Boswells, to Dunse;" and that an additional provision is proposed to be inserted in the said Bill, authorising a Deviation in the Course of the intended Railway, as shown on the plans deposited, in pursuance of the Standing Orders of Parliament in the month of November last; such Deviation commencing on and from the Line of the Railway, as shown on the said Plans, at a point marked thereon, One Furlong or thereabouts from its Commencement and Junction of said Line of Railway with the Hawick Branch of the North British Railway, such Point of Deviation being at a point at or near the Farm-Steading of Broomhill, in the Parish of Melrose and County of Roxburgh; such Deviation passing in the Line laid down on the Plans to be Deposited as hereinafter mentioned, and being wholly situate in the said Parish and County; and terminating on the Line of the intended Railway, as laid down on said Deposited Plans first hereinbefore mentioned, at or near a point marked thereon, One Mile Three Furlongs, and near to the Farm-Steading of Drygrange Mains, also in the Parish and County aforesaid.

And Power will be taken for the Compulsory Purchase of Lands, Houses, and other Property which may be required for the purposes of the said Deviation; to Levy Tolls, Rates, and Duties in respect thereof; to vary and extinguish all Rights and Privileges which may interfere with the said Deviation; and in all respects the said Deviation shall form part of the said Bill, and be subject to the Powers and Provisions thereof, and of the Acts incorporated therewith.

And Notice is Hereby Given, that Duplicate Plans and Sections of the said intended Deviation, showing the Line, Situation, and Levels thereof, and the Lands, Houses, and other Property, which may be taken for the purposes thereof, with Books of Reference to such Plans, containing the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners, Lessees or reputed Lessees, and Occupiers of such Lands, Houses, and other Property respectively; and a Published Map, showing the general course of the said proposed Deviation, together with a Copy of this Notice, as published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, will be deposited, for public inspection, on or before the Twenty-First Day of April 1862, in the Office at Jedburgh of the principal Sheriff-Clerk of the County of Roxburgh; and that, on or before the same day, a Copy of the said Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference, and a Copy of the said *Gazette* Notice, will be deposited with the Schoolmaster, or, if there be no Schoolmaster, with the Session-Clerk, of the said Parish of Melrose, at the residence of such Schoolmaster or Session-Clerk; and, previous to said Bill authorising such Deviation being brought

from the House of Commons to the House of Lords, a Copy of the said Plan and Section will be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments.
