The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Hon. Henry Dundas, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Right Hon. William Wyndham. Baron Grenville, and his Grace William Henry Cavendish Duke of Portland, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter (his Majesty's other Principal Secretary of State); the Right Hon. William Pitt, Chancellor of his Majesty's Exchequer, his Grace James Duke of Montrose, Knight of the Most Ancient Order of the Thistle, the Right Hon. Robert Grosvenor, commonly called Viscount Belgrave, the Right Hon. Henry Earl Bathurst, the Right Hon. Sylvester Douglas, William Dundas, Esq. the Right Hon. George Canning, and Thomas Wallace, Esq. to be his Majesty's Commissioners for the management of the affairs of India.
