The Sequestrated Estate of JOHN MATHER, Cattle-dealer and Grazier, residing in Dollar, now deceased.

DAVID ANDERSON, Farmer, Lyne, Peeblesshire, Trustee on the said sequestrated estate, found it necessary, in order to save expence to the estate, to
