Copy of a letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Keith, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the Mediterranean, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated on board the Minotaur, at sea, the 24th of June, 1800.

SIR,

I have the honour of inclosing, for their Lordships' information, a list of vessels captured by his Majesty's ships employed under my command, between the 1st of April and 14th of June, except those of which returns have already been transmitted.

Nine Germs, laden with rice, coffee, gum Arabic, raw and spun flax, coarse linen, eggs, fowls, onions, &c. fire-wood, 136 gold pieces, three bags of praws, one bag of piastres, 1201 German and French crowns, 317 Spanish dollars, which were taken out of them on the coast of Egypt, and the Germs sent away—taken by the Theseus, Captain Stiles, between January 8, and February 2, 1800.

(A long list follows of captures and recaptures, comprising seven privateers and other armed vessels, from 1 to 15 guns, and 78 merchantmen, many of them with valuable cargoes.)

Computed from the Returns of the Quantities and Prices made during the Six Weeks preceding this day, and taken in the manner directed by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the thirty-ninth and fortieth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for granting Bounties on the Importation of Wheat, Wheaten Flour, and Rice, until the first day of October, 1800,"

Is Thirty-two Shillings and Three Pence Farthing per Hundred Weight,

Which, by the authority of Parliament is directed to be deemed and taken as the Average Price of Rice in the London Market, for the purpose of regulating the payment of the Bounty on Rice imported or brought into some one or other of his Majesty's ports in the said act mentioned.
