The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Emma Sarah de Rochow, of Hyde Park Gardens, in the county of Middlesex, the wife of Adam Ernest de Rochow, of the city of Paris, and late the widow of Henry James Wheeler, formerly of Hyde Park Gardens aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, and to Llewelyn Uynne, of Lincoln's Inn Fields, in

the said county of Middlesex, Gentleman, the guardians of the children of the said Henry James Wheeler, on behalf of his third son Herbert Reginald Wheeler, a minor of the age of eighteen years and upwards, Her royal licence and authority that he, the said Herbert Reginald Wheeler, may take and use the surname of Ray in lieu and instead of that of Wheeler, and bear the arms of Ray quarterly with those of Wheeler; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise Her Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect;

Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Archangel, enclosing a copy of a letter addressed to him by the Chief of the Custom-house at that port, stating that during the present navigation vessels might come direct up to the harbour of Sollombol, provided that any vessel on board of which contagious disease has occurred during the voyage should stop at Lapominka harbour, and that masters of vessels on board of which any such disease had appeared, should, on arrival at Mudinga Island, give notice thereof to the pilots who usually convey vessels along the channel of the Dwina, and should, under the direction of those pilots, cast anchor in Lapominka harbour to perform quarantine duties as soon as they enter the mouth of the Dwina, a yellow flag, and in no case permitting the landing of passengers on board the ships to go on shore until the completion of the quarantine term.
