ENCLOSE a copy of a letter from Captain Halfted, of his Majesty's ship Phoenix, acquainting me with the interception of the French national veffel La Revanche, from Toulon, with dispatches and provisions for Malta; and have

My Lord, Phanix, at Sea, June 18. 1800.

I Beg leave to acquaint your Lordship, that early yesterday morning, being off the Hieres Islands, and little wind, I sent Lieutenant Thompson, with the boats of his Majesty's ship. Phoenix, in chace of a small vessel standing in for Hieres Bay; and at nine A. M. they cap-tured her. She proved to be La Revanche French national veffel, coppered, mounting four carriage guns and four Iwivels, with 27 men, partly laden with brandy, wine, cheefe, and pork, two days from Toulon, and bound to Malta with dispatches, which were thrown overboard.

I am forry to add, that in capturing the above weffel we loft one man; and unfortunately this morning, it blowing strong, she overset, but happily no lives lost.
