Copy of a letter from Vice-Admiral Lutwidge, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the Downs, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated the 2d inst. SIR,

I beg leave to enclose to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter which I have received from Mr Stephen Butcher, master of his Majesty's hired lugger Nile (3), giving me an account of his having last night fallen in with and captured the Renard French cutter privateer, of Catais, mounting two three-pounders, and having on board thirteen men.
