Copy of a letter from Vice-Admiral Lutwidge, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the Downs, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated the 2d inst. SIR,

I beg leave to enclose to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter which I have received from Mr Stephen Butcher, master of his Majesty's hired lugger Nile (3), giving me an account of his having last night fallen in with and captured the Renard French cutter privateer, of Catais, mounting two three-pounders, and having on board thirteen men. Nile Lugger (3.), Downs, Nov. 2. 1800. Lieutenant Whitehead being fick on shore, I beg leave to acquaint you, that at nine o'clock last night, while in the execution of your orders, I fell in with. and captured, off Folkstone, the Renard French cutter privateer, of Calais, Wichael Bernard Hamelin, commander, carrying two three pounders, and thir-teen men, at the time she was alongside a laden merchant ship standing in for the Downs; the privateer. left Calais at four o'clock yesterday afternoon.
