WHEREAS an Act was passed in the 19th and 20th years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the Removal of Nuisances, Regulation of Lodging-houses, and the Health of Towns in Scotland"; and by the 22d Section of the said Act it is enacted, that whenever any part of the United Kingdom appears to be threaten'd with, or is affected by any formidable epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them (the Lord President of the Council, or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State being one), may, by Order or Orders by them from time to time made, direct that the provisions for the prevention of diseases contained in Part II. of the said recited Act be put in force in Scotland, or in such parts thereof, or in such places therein, as in such Order or Orders may be expressed, and may from time to time, as to all or any of the parts or places to which any such Order or Orders extend, and in like manner revoke or renew any such Order; and, subject to revocation and renewal, as aforesaid, every such Order shall be in force for six calendar months, or for such shorter period as in such Order shall be expressed; and every such Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any Members thereof, as aforesaid, shall be certified under the hand of the Clerk in Ordinary of Her Majesty's Privy Council, and shall be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, and such publication shall be conclusive evidence of such Order:

And whereas the United Kingdom is affected with a certain epidemic disease, that is to say, the Asiatic Cholera; and whereas by an Order of Council, dated the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* the fifth day of

said month and year, it was ordered that the said provisions for the prevention of diseases contained in Part II. of said recited Act should be put in force in Scotland for the space of six calendar months after the publication of said Order in the *Edinburgh Gazette*; and whereas the said Order will, unless renewed, expire on the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and it is expedient that it should be renewed for a farther space:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above recited Section of the said recited Act, the Lords of the Council do Order, and it is hereby Ordered, that the provisions for the prevention of diseases contained in Part II. of the Act 19 & 20 Vict., cap. 103, be continued in force in Scotland for the space of six calendar months after the fifth day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, dated the 29th day of November 1866, the provisions for the Prevention of Diseases, contained in Part II. of the Act 19 & 20 Vict., c. 103, are continued in force in Scotland for the space of Six Calendar Months after the 5th day of December 1866:

THEREFORE, exercising the powers conferred upon them by the 24th Section of the foresaid Statute, and continued in operation by the said Order in Council, the Board of Supervision renew the several Directions and Regulations issued by them on the 7th day of June, the 1st day of August, the 16th day of August, the 4th day of October, and the 29th day of November 1866; and continue the same in force, unless revoked or altered, for the space of Six Calendar Months after the 5th day of December 1866.

## PRISON OF KIRKCUDBRIGHT.

The Right Honorable Spencer Horatio Walpole, one of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and Principal Secretary of State, &c., &c., &c.

In virtue of the powers contained in the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, 1860, I do hereby Order and Intimate that the BUILDING which has hitherto been the PRISON of KIRKCUDBRIGHT, in the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright, shall, on and after the 1st day of January 1867, CEASE to be a Legal Prison; and further, that, on the said Building ceasing to be a Legal Prison, the NEW BUILDING erected for a Prison in Kirkcudbright, containing twelve cells for Male Criminals, six cells for Female Criminals, and four cells for Debtors, with refractory and reception cells, bath room, room for the warder, and offices, shall, as the PRISON of KIRKCUDBRIGHT, be a Legal Prison for the detention of all descriptions of Civil and Criminal Prisoners; and that, on the said 1st day of January 1867, all Prisoners who may be legally detained in the Prison of Kirkcudbright shall be removed to the said New Building.
