Copy of a letter from Mr THOMAS ALTI, Commander of the Hawke private ship of war, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated at Viana in Portugal, Oct. 22. 1800.

SIR,

You will be pleased to acquaint my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty I yesterday fell in with and captured the Spanish latine privateer called the Atalante, of Pontc Vedra, Captain Don Bernardo Lopes, of 10 guns and 56 men, having come out of the port of Arofa the day before, and was just on the point of capturing a British vessel when I fell in with her. In running from me she threw six of her guns overboard; the four I found on board were long fixes and nines. I brought her in here, and delivered the 56 men to his Britannic Majesty's Consul.—I have the honour to be, &c.
