THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto William Davenport-Bromley, of Baginton Hall, in the parish of Baginton, in the county of Warwick, and of Wootton Hall, in the parish of Ellaston, in the county of Stafford, Esquire, one of the Knights of the Shire for the Northern Division of the said county of Warwick, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Queen's Own Royal Regiment of Staffordshire Yeomanry Cavalry, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a direction contained in the last will and testament of his cousin Arthur Henry Davenport, late of Capesthorpe Hall, in the county palatine of Chester, Esquire, deceased, discontinue to use the surname of Davenport before that of Bromley, and that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Davenport in addition to and after that of Bromley, and be called and known by the names of William Bromley-Davenport, and bear the arms of Davenport quarterly in the first quarter with those of Bromley, and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

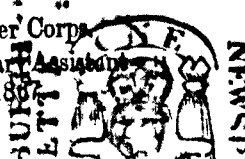
