ALEXANDER SCOTT'S HOSPITAL.

IN obedience to a Remit from the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament assembled, all parties concerned in a Petition of Lachlan Duff Gordon Duff, James Milne, William Murdoch, the Right Reverend Robert Eden, the Reverend William Duguid (at present Moderator of the Presbytery of Strathbogie), the Reverend James Walker, and the Reverend John Ferguson Macdonald, the Trustees and Managers of Alexander Scott's Hospital, at Huntly, in the County of Aberdeen, acting in virtue of the Trust-Disposition and Deed of Settlement therein-mentioned, praying leave to bring in a Bill to incorporate the Trustees and Managers of ALEXANDER SCOTT'S HOSPITAL, at Huntly, in the County of Aberdeen, and to extend the benefits thereof, are appointed to appear before the Lord Justice-Clerk of the Court of Session in Scotland, and Lord Barcaple in Scotland, or in their absence, or the absence of either of them, the Lord President of the Court of Session in Scotland, and Lord Mure in Scotland, within the Judges' Robing-room, Parliament Square, Edinburgh, on Monday the 13th day of January 1868, at 12 o'clock noon, when they will be heard for their interests in the said Bill.
