So soon as the Procession had passed into the Cathedral HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS OF WALES and HER EXCELLENCY THE MARCHIONESS OF ABERCORN, attended by their respective Suites, as well as by the Countess of Howth, the Marchioness of Headfort, the Countess of Arran, The Lady Farnham, the Countess of Granard, the Lady Dufferin and Claneboye, the Countess of Charlemont, and the Marchioness of Drogheda (Wives of Knights of the Order present), were received by the Hereditary Grand Seneschal of Ireland, the Earl of Waterford (the Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot), and conducted up the Middle Aisle to the Dais prepared for Her Royal Highness and Her Excellency.

CHAPTER ROOM.

On entering the Chapter Room, the Dean conducted His Excellency the Grand Master to his Throne, and the Installed Knights took their seats, their Esquires standing behind them. The Knight to be Installed, HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, stood at his Seat, the first at the Chapter table ; and His Royal Highness's Esquires deposited on the table His Royal Highness's Mantle and Sword, and fixed His Royal Highness's Banner in the place appointed. The Dean then retired to robe, and returning to the Chapter, as Register of the Order, made his reverence to the Grand Master, read Her Majesty's direction that the Installation be held, and informed His Excellency that there was no other business before the Chapter, but to carry into effect the Sovereign's Commands, by installing HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES. His Excellency then rose and signified his pleasure that it be forthwith done, whereupon a Procession from the Chapter Room to the Choir was formed in the following Order ;—
