PRESENT,
The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas his Majesty has received advice, that a large number of vessels belonging to his Majesty's subjects have been and are detained in the ports of Russia, and that the British saliors navigating the Russia, and that the British failors navigating the same have been and now are detained, as prisoners, in different parts of Russia; and also, that, during the continuance of these proceedings, a consederacy, of a hostile nature, against the just rights and interest of his Majesty, and his dominions, has been entered into with the Court of St Petersburgh by the Courts of Denmark and Sweden respectively, his Majesty, with the advice of his Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, rs it is hereby ordered, that no ships or vessels belonging to any of his Majesty's subjects be permitted to enter or clear out for any of the ports of Russia. Denmark, and Sweden, until of the ports of Ruffia, Denmark, and Sweden, until further orders; and his Majetty is further pleased to order, that a general embargo or stop be made now of all Ruffian, Danish, and Swedish ships and now of all Russian, Danish, and Swedish ships and vessels whatsoever, within, or which hereafter shall come into any ports, harbours, or roads, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all persons and effects on board the said ships and vessels; but that the utmost care be taken for the preservation of all and every part of the cargoes on board any of the said ships and vessels, so that no damage or embezzlement whatever he sustained. be fustained.
