This day the Most Reverend Father in God William Lord Archsbishop of Armagh, Primate of all Ireland, was, by his Majetty's command fworn of his Majetty's Most Honourable Privy Council for the united kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

property of his Majesty's subjects, or the propleased, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all goods laden on board Russian, Danish, or Swedish vessels now detained under the said embargo, and intended to be exported, shall be delivered to the disposal of the owners or their agents, upon affidavit made and produced to the officer in whose custody the said vessels may be, that the faid goods were not at the time of shipment, nor are now, the property of the subjects of Rusfia, Denmark, or Sweden; and also, that all goods, which, by virtue of licences under his Majesty's fign manual, have been imported in vessels belonging to the subjects of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden, shall in like manner be forthwith delivered to the disposal of the owners or their agents, on their making and producing a like assidavit, and on sufficient proof that his Majeity's licence to import the said goods had been obtained.

And his Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all goods which have been imported into this country in Russian, Danish, or Swedish vessels, without licence under his Majesty's sign manual, and which are now detained by the embargo, shall likewise be delivered to-the owners or their agents, on affidavit being made that such goods were not at the time of shipment, nor are now, the property of subjects of Russa, Denmark, or Sweden; and on their giving sufficient baileto abide adjudication, if any proceedings should be commenced against the said goods within two months from the date of fuch delihis Majelly, that the goods on board feveral of very; but in case no such proceedings should be and the vessels so detained by the embargo are the commenced within two months from the date of

fuch delivery, then the bond so given to be void: And the Right Hon, the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commis-sioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the ne-ceffary directions herein as to them may respective appertain.

Copy of a letter from Admiral LUTWIDGE, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the Downs, to EVAN NEPEAN, Elq. dated the 28th instant.

I inclose to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter which I have just received from Lieut. Pearce, commanding the King George hired cutter, giving me an account of his having this morning captured the Flibustier cutter privateer.

I am, Sir, &c. Skeff. Lutwidge.

King George hired armed cutter, Downs, January 28. 1801. SIR.

I have the pleasure to inform you, that about one o'clock this morning I captured the French cutter privateer Le Flibustier, commanded by

Deslogue, manned with fixteen men, with muskets and pistols: She had been out from Dunkirk two days, and had made no captures.

Copy of a letter from Captain JOHN GIFFARD, com-manding his Majesty's ship Active, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated at sea, the 26th instant.

His Majesty's ship under my command this morning captured the French cutter privateer Le Quinola, carrying fourteen guns, fix and twopounders, and forty-eight men, after a chace of

two hours: She failed from Morlaix yesterday morning, and had not made a capture.
