The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Charleston, reporting that the Health Authorities at that Port have issued Quarantine regulations for the Ports of Georgetown, Charleston, and Hilton Head, on the coast of South Carolina, to the following effect :—

1stly. That all vessels from any place where pestilential, contagious, or infectious disease existed at the time of their departure, or on board of which any case of such disease shall have occurred, arriving between the 1st May and the 1st November, shall remain at Quarantine for at least thirty days after their arrival, and at least twenty days after their cargo shall have been discharged.

2dly. That all vessels from any port in Asia, Africa, or the Mediterranean, or from any of the West Indies, Bahama, Bermuda, or Western Islands, or from any place in America south of Hilton Head, and all vessels on board of which, during the voyage or while at the port of their departure, any person shall have been sick, arriving between the 1st May and 1st November, shall, on arrival at the Quarantine ground, be subject to visitation

by the Health Officers, but shall not be detained unless they shall have had on board, during the voyage, some case of infectious, contagious, or pestilential disease; and

3dly. All vessels navigated by steam shall be subject only to such length of quarantine and regulations as the Health Officers shall enjoin.

Tide Signals, Trouville Port.

The French Government has given notice that
the tide signals at Trouville Harbour are now
made from the earthworks of La Cahotte; they
will show the least depth of water found in the
whole extent of the Channel, commencing at 6
feet, and indicate the change every quarter of a
metre (about three quarters of a foot), according
to the system of tide signals adopted for the coast
of France.
