### BURGH OF PERTH.

**RE** DIVISION OF THE BURGH INTO WARDS UNDER THE

PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS AMENDMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1868.

W E, JOHN PULLAR, Esq., Lord Provost and Chief Magistrate of the City and Royal Burgh of Perth, JOHN TAIT, Esq., Sheriff Principal of the County of Perth, in which said City is situate, and WILLIAM SMYTHE, Esq. of Methven, named and appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department under the Provision of the shore mentioned Department, under the Provisions of the above-mentioned Act, Commissioners thereby appointed for the purpose of Re-dividing the said City and Burgh into the same number Re-dividing the said city and Burgh into the same number of Wards into which it is now divided, each Ward being numbered, and having a distinctive name or number, having had regard to the number of Municipal Electors, and also to the value of the Property in each Ward, as appearing in the Valuation Roll, and caused our proposed division into Wards to be delineated upon a Plan, and due notion to be given by Advetigement in two Newmonson division into Wards to be delineated upon a Plan, and due notice to be given by Advertisement in two Newspapers published within the said Burgh, where said Plan was to be seen, and that on this day we should hear all concerned for their interests within the Town-Hall, Perth, at Twelve o'clock noon; and having then and there attended for said purpose accordingly, and none appearing to object, do now report to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department that we have finally adjusted the proposed division as follows—viz. adjusted the proposed division as follows-viz.,

#### WARD FIRST

To consist of the territory lying within a line commencing at the River Tay at the east end of the High Street, and proceeding along that Street westward to the High Street Port; and from thence proceeding southward by South Methven Street and King Street to Victoria Street; from thence by a straight line eastward to the River Tay; and from thence northward by said River to the first men-tioned point at the east end of the High Street.

#### WARD SECOND

To consist of the territory lying within a line commenc-ing at the River Tay at the south-east corner of the First Ward, and proceeding in a straight line to the middle of Victoria Street, and westward along that Street to King Street; from thence northward to South Street Port; from thence westward by County Place, York Place, and the Glasgow Road to the Toll-Bar at the Powder Magazine; from thence along the western and southern

boundary of the extended Royalty to the Friarton Pier and Friarton Island; from thence northward to the Railway Bridge across the Tay ; from thence along the south side of the Railway Bridge westward to the Mainland; and from thence along the River northward to the first mentioned point in a straight line with the middle of Victoria Street.

# WARD THIRD

To consist of the territory lying within a line commenc-ing at the River Tay at the east end of the High Street, and proceeding along that Street westward to the High Street Port; thence northward along Methyen Street to Will Street , thence northward along Methyen Street to Comfort Mill Street; thence eastward along Mill Street to Curfew Row; from thence along Curfew Row and North Port to the west or lower end of Charlotte Street; from thence in a straight line to the Horse Watering Place on the west side of the River Tay, a short way above Perth Bridge; and from thence southward by the River to the place first above-mentioned as to this Ward at the east end of the High Street; and also of all the territory within the ex-tended Royalty lying on the east side of the River Tay.

## WARD FOURTH

To consist of the territory lying within a line commenc-ing at the foresaid Horse Watering Place, running in a straight line to North Port and along Curfew Row, to Mill Street; from thence westward along Mill Street, and southward along Methven Street to South Street Port; from thence proceeding westward along County Place, York Place, and the Glasgow Road to the Toll-Bar at the Powder Magazine; from thence proceeding northward along the line of the extended boundary till it reaches the along the line of the extended boundary till it reaches the point at the northern boundary of the Burgh on the right bank of the River Tay; and from thence proceeding southward along said River to the foresaid Horse Watering Place; and also of all the territory being Royalty, and within the Parliamentary boundaries of the Burgh not included in any of the other Wards. Declaring that the boundaries of the said Wards shall be understood to run along the middle of the Streets. Roads

understood to run along the middle of the Streets, Roads, and River by which they are described to be bounded, except where the contrary is particularly mentioned.

And we farther fix and determine that each of the Wards above described, bearing the distinctive numbers from one to four, respectively, shall come in room and place of and be substituted for the existing Wards bearing the same distinctive numbers in returning members to the Town-Council in lieu of those who retire by rotation.
