SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

In pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," Notice is Hereby Given that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased Soldiers named in the List which is published with this Notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to the "Under Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldiers' Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the Soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his Regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars, furnished by the applicant, not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased Soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then, within three calendar months, the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the Clergyman, or one of the Churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace. The applicant's address, with the name of the post-town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further Lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the Notice in which the deceased Soldier's name appeared.

(No. 77.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—ADRIATIC.— TRIESTE BAY.

Alteration in Position of Grado Light Vessel.

The Austrian Government has given notice that, in consequence of changes in the adjacent banks, the light-vessel off Grado, near Port Primero, has been moved in a N. 3 W. direction 2470 yards.

Note.—The flashing apparatus of the light-vessel being liable to derangement, the flashes occasionally do not succeed each other with the

intended regularity.

Fixed Light on Point Sottile.

Also that, from the 1st day of October 1869, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Point Sottile, South point of Muja bay, Trieste bay.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 46 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the fourth order.

The tower is 36 feet high, round, built of greyish stone, and is attached to, and rises from the centre of the keeper's dwelling.

The position, as given, is in lat. 45° 36' N.,

long. 13° 43' East from Greenwich.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 13° Westerly in 1869.]

Rock, near Enchadas Island.

Information has been received of the discovery of a small rock by Squire T. C. Lecky, Lieutenant R. N.R., commanding the Steam-Ship Halley, near the Isle des Enchadas (the Coaling Island), in the

Harbour of Rio de Janeiro.

The Rock lies E. by S. 3 S., about one cable from the jetty, on the east point of the Isle des Enchadas; it is 50 feet in diameter, conical, with 2½ fathoms on it at low water springs, and is

steep to on all sides.

From the rock the chimney on Rat Island appears twice its apparent breadth to the left of the base of the eastern slope of the Sugar-loaf, and the same chimney on with the centre of the summit of the Sugar-loaf, leads between it and the Baixo das Feiticeiras in from 6 to 8 fathoms There is likewise a deep channel to the westward of the rock, but vessels are recommended to pass outside, or to the eastward of Baixo das Feiticeiras.
