## SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS.

AT an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of this Company, duly convened, and held at the London Tavern, No. 123, Bishopsgate Street Within, in the City of London, on the 31st day of December 1869, the following Special Resolutions were duly passed; and at a subsequent Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company, also duly convened, and held at the same place on the 17th day of January 1870, the following Special Resolutions were duly confirmed:—

'Whereas by a Resolution of the Company passed in accordance with the Telegraph Act, 1868, on the 3d day of September 1868, the undertaking of the Company was sold to the Postmaster-General, and the price to be paid has been duly settled, and the purchase-money and compensation has been awarded and determined, and the Postmaster-General has signified his readiness to pay such purchase-money and compensation in the month of January 1870; and in order to discharge all the debts of the Company and to distribute the residue of the purchase-money and compensation among the Shareholders, it is necessary to wind up the Company:

'Resolved that the Company be wound up voluntarily; that Alexander Angus Croll, Esq., the Chairman of the Company, be, and he is hereby appointed Liquidator; and that the present Directors be, and they are hereby requested to continue to exercise their powers as Directors.'

## ROXBURGHSHIRE POLLING PLACES.

## NOTICE.

THE Sheriff of Roxburgh and Selkirk hereby gives Notice, in terms of the Act 16 and 17 Vict., cap. 28, sec. 2, that he proposes to alter the POLLING PLACES AND DISTRICTS in the COUNTY OF ROXBURGH, so that not more than 300 Electors may Poll at any one place.

The proposed Polling Places and Districts are as follow, vizt. :—

1. HAWICK:—For the Parishes of Ashkirk, Cavers, Hawick, Kirkton, Minto, Robertson, Teviothead, and Wilton.
2. JEDBURGH:—For the Parishes of Ancrum, Bedrule, Crailing, Hobkirk, Jedburgh, Oxnam, and Southdean.
3. KELSO:—For the Voters in the Parish of Kelso whose surnames do not begin with the letters A. B. or C.
4. MAXWELLHEUGH:—For the Parishes of Eckford, Ednam, for those Voters in the Parish of Kelso whose surnames begin with the letters A. B. or C., and for the Parishes of Makerstoun, Roxburgh, Smailholm, Sprouston, and Stitchell.
5. MOREBATTLE:—For the Parishes of Hownam, Linton, Morebattle, and Yetholm.
6. ST BOSWELLS:—For the Parishes of Bowden, Maxton, St Boswells, and Lilliesleaf.
7. MELROSE:—For the Parishes of Lindean, Melrose, and Selkirk.
8. NEW-CASTLETON:—For the Parish of Castleton.
