Board of Trade, Whitehall, March 10, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Ambassador of the North German Confederation at this Court, inclosing a copy of a Notification issued by the Directors of the General Industrial Exhibition for all kinds of Domestic Articles, about to take place at Cassel.

This Notification extends the time for announcement by manufacturers in foreign countries to

the 1st April next, in order to ensure the participation of other than German productions for domestic purposes; and fixes the 20th May next (instead of the 15th) as the latest date for the reception of other than German manufactures at Cassel.

The Directors of the Exhibition also give notice that such articles as may not be sold at the Exhibition will be entitled to return carriage free on all Prussian State roads, and railroads under State administration, and that a similar advantage on private roads has already been partly, and will soon it is hoped be wholly, secured.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, March 10, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a Decree which was issued by the Government of Salvador on the 16th December last, and which contains the following Articles:—

Art. I. Alcohol that is for the future imported into the Republic shall pay a duty of four reales (two shillings) per bottle.

Art. II. The present resolution shall come into force three months after the date of its publication in the Official Gazette (16th December 1869).
