Board of Trade, Whitehall, October 13, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular Note issued by the Ottoman Government, announcing that the exportation of wheat and barley from the province of Bosnia has been temporarily prohibited.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, October 17, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin, a copy of a Decree of the Prussian Government, annulling the prohibition of the export and transit of oats and bran across the frontier from Memel to Saarbruck. The Decree is dated 3d October, from which time it came into force.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, October 17, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Madrid, copies of two Spanish Decrees of the 4th and 6th instant respectively, by which the ports of Alicante and Palma are declared foul in consequence of the appearance of yellow fever.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, October 18, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador in France, communicating an extract from a Decree dated 12th instant, relative to the prohibition of the export of provisions from that country, and of which the following is a translation.

The export, the re-exportation from bond, and the transit of cattle of all kinds, provisions, grain, flour, alimentary supplies of every sort, bran, and fodder, are prohibited over the whole extent of the frontiers of the Republic.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, October 17, 1870.

The Board of Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consulat Hamburgh, stating that the lights and buoys in the River Elbe, the restoration of which had been commenced, have been again removed.

#### SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAITED.

In pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," Notice is Hereby Given that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased Soldiers maned in the Lit which is published with this Notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W." and marked outside "Soldiers' Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the Soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his Regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known

Should these particulars, furnished by the applicant, not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased Soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then, within three calendar months, the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the Clergyman, or one of the Churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace. The applicant's address, with the name of the post-town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further Lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the Notice in which the deceased Soldier's name appeared.
