Board of Trade, Whitehall, October 27, 1870.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, reporting that the Danish Government have, in consequence of the outbreak of cholera at St Petersburg, enacted the following Quarantine Regulations to be observed by all vessels arriving from that city:—

All vessels coming from an infected port or place shall neither land passengers, nor crew, nor have any communication with the shore, until the quarantine doctor has been on board and granted them free pratique.

Vessels coming from such infected ports or places shall, on arrival in the roads, immediately hoist the quarantine flag, or in place thereof a white flag, on the main top.

Masters of vessels neglecting to comply with the above regulations will be liable to a fine of 500 kigsdollars.
