Board of Trade (Harbour Department), December 17, 1870.

The Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch, dated the 23d ultimo, from Her Majesty's Consulat the Azores, to the effect that the Portuguese Government had recently authorized the Local Treasury at St Michael's to advance eight contos of reis (8,000\$ 000 reis), (about £1,500), for the purpose of continuing the works of the artificial harbour of that place; that this sum might be expected to keep the labourers employed for another month upon the construction of the breakwater; and that in the meantime it was expected that, in accordance with what is reported to be their intention, the Portuguese Government would adopt legislative measures for securing the funds necessary for the completion of the enterprise.
