The Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of Alberic, Baron Willoughby de Eresby and third Baron Gwydir, unmarried and without issue, on the 26th day of August last, the title and dignity of Baron Gwydir devolved upon his cousin Peter Robert, now Baron Gwydir, as the eldest surviving son and heir of Merrik Lindsey Peter Burrell, commonly called the Honourable Merrik Lindsey Peter Burrell, who was second son of Peter, first Baron Gwydir, and next brother of Peter Robert, Baron Willoughby de Eresby (in right of his mother) and second Baron Gwydir, and that according to the ordinary rules of honour the sisters of the said Peter Robert, now Baron Gwydir, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their said late father had

survived the said Alberic, Baron Willoughby de Eresby and Baron Gwydir, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Gwydir, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Marcia Sarah Elizabeth, the wife of Walter Whittington, of Albemarle House, in the County of Devon, Esquire, and Charlotte Anne, wife of Charles Wilmot Smith, of Ballynanty House, in the county of Limerick, Esquire, sisters of the said Peter Robert, now Baron Gwydir, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father the said Merrik Lindsey Peter Burrell had survived his nephew the said Alberic, Baron Willoughby de Eresby and Baron Gwydir, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Baron Gwydir.

And to command that the said Royal order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

(No. 131.)—ENGLAND—WEST COAST—MILFORD HAVEN.

Fixed Leading Lights on Great Castle Head.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 108, dated 14th October 1870, respecting the establishment of two leading *fixed* white lights on Great Castle Head, to facilitate the navigation of Milford Haven :

The Trinity House, London, has given Notice that the lights are now exhibited.

The upper light, elevated 112 feet above high water, is exhibited from a tower, and the lower light, 76 feet above high water, from a window in the light-keeper's dwelling.

The two lights in line, bearing N.E. by E.  $\frac{2}{3}$  E., lead in deep water between St. Ann's Head and Mid-channel Rock.

**BRISTOL CHANNEL.**

Extension of Red Sector in Flatholm Light.

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 93, dated 15th September 1870, respecting the extension of the red sector of light exhibited from Flatholm Lighthouse :
