At a general meeting of the said Creditors, held at Dumfries, upon the 14th day of February last, for the purpose of giving directions to the trustee, regarding a sale of the heritable property, and outstanding debts belonging to the bankrupt the Creditors present were unanimously of opinion, that as none of the outstanding debts seemed to be recoverable, they were not worth the expence of diligence against the debtors, nor consequently of the expence which would attend the sale of them.

Before taking a step of such importance, however, the Trustee thinks it his duty to obtain the sanction of a general meeting, called for that par-

ticular purpose: Another General Meeting of the Creditors will therefore take place in Nairne's coffeehouse, at Dumfries, upon the 15th day of May next, at noon, in order either to confirm the resolutions of the meeting of the 14th February last, or to give directions to the trustee regarding a sale of the outstanding debts and heritable property belonging to the bankrupt, as directed by Act of Parliament.

Nota.—The Trustee has not been able to recover any of the bankrupt's debts or effects since the dividend made under authority of the general annual meeting in May last. There is not at present, therefore, any fund for a second division among the Creditors.
