14th of April, 1801,

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in  
Council.

His Majesty in Council was this day  
graciously pleased to deliver the Great Seal  
to the Right Honourable John Lord Eldon,  
whereupon the oath of Lord High  
Chancellor of Great Britain was, by his  
Majesty's command, administered to his  
Lordship, and his Lordship took his place  
at the Board accordingly.
