'ACTS TO REGULATE AND AMEND THE LAW ' RESPECTING

#### 'THE SALMON FISHERIES OF SCOTLAND.'

District of the River NITH.

WHEREAS, by a Bye Law which took effect VV from 7th March 1865, the Annual Close Time for the District of the River Nith is declared to be from 27th August to 10th February, with extension of time for Rod Fishing from 27th August to 31st October; and whereas a Petition has been presented by the District Board of the said River Nith, to me, the Right Honourable H. A. Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in terms of the 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' praying for an alteration of the present Annual Close Time; and whereas, after having directed enquiry to be made in the District of the said River Nith, in terms of the above-mentioned 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' I am satisfied that the Annual Close Time applicable to the said District should be varied; therefore I, the said Right Honourable H. A. Bruce, by the present Order given under my hand, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by the above-mentioned 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' do hereby order and direct that the Annual Close Time applicable Henry Charles Stone, of 2741, Strand, Middlesex, and to the District of the said River Nith shall be 10, Molesworth Street, Lewisham, Kent.
