By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council.

PRESENT,

Lord President. Mr. Forster.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869 (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869), and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in

the Act of 1869.

2. The Order bearing date the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, prohibiting the landing in Great Britain of cattle, manure, and hay, and regulating the landing in Great Britain of sheep, goats, and certain articles brought from any place in Belgium or France (which Order has already been revoked as far as the same related to cattle, sheep, and goats brought from any place in Belgium), is hereby further revoked as far as such Order relates to cattle, sheep, and goats

brought from any place in France.
3. The Second Schedule to The Foreign Animals Order of 1871 shall be read and have effect as if France was included in the list of

countries therein named.

4. Nothing in this Order shall invalidate or 4. Nothing in this Order shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order of the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any

penalty incurred under, the Act of 1869, or the said Order of the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.
