The Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and Principal Secretary of State, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Prison of Alloa, in the County of Clackmannan, as rendered a Legal Prison by the late General Board of Directors of Prisons, by an Order dated on the twenty-seventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, has, with the approval of the Secretary of State, been altered in so far that the same contains the accommodation following, viz., fourteen Cells for the detention of Male Criminal Prisoners, seven Cells for the detention of Female Criminal Prisoners, one Room for the detention of Civil Prisoners, an Exercising Yard for Male

Prisoners, an Exercising Yard for Female Prisoners, a Bath Room for Male Prisoners, a Bath Room for Female Prisoners, a Kitchen, a Washing-house, and Store Rooms:

In virtue of the powers contained in the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, 1860, I do hereby order and intimate that the Building, as so altered and enlarged, shall, on and after the nineteenth day of September 1872, under the name of the Prison of Alloa, be a Legal Prison for the detention of all descriptions of Civil and Criminal Prisoners.
