THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869 (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869), and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked to the extent in that Schedule mentioned.

3. Nothing in this Order shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Act of 1869, or the said Order.

SCHEDULE.

The Order of Council of the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, prohibiting the landing in Great Britain of cattle, manure, and hay brought from any place in Belgium or France, and regulating the landing in Great Britain of sheep, goats, and certain articles brought from any place in Belgium or France.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1869.

Notice is hereby given, that by virtue of various Orders of Council issued by the Lords of the Council, in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, the Second Schedule to The Foreign Animals Order of 1871 has been from time to time altered, so that in effect it now stands as follows:—

The Austrian Hungarian Empire.
The Empire of Germany.
The dominions of the Sultan.
The dominions of the King of Italy.
The dominions of the King of the Hellenes.
Belgium.
France.

All cattle imported from the countries scheduled

must be slaughtered within ten days after the landing thereof (unless landed at Southampton for quarantine).

The landing in Great Britain of cattle brought from any place in the dominions of the Emperor of Russia is prohibited.

The landing of cattle from no other country is prohibited.

The landing of cattle from any country other than scheduled countries and Russia is unrestricted, and healthy cattle after twelve hours' detention may be moved alive from the place of landing.
