THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869 (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869), and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of

2. Farcy is hereby declared to be a contagious disease for the purposes of the Act of 1869, and all the provisions relating to contagious or infectious disease contained in any Order of Council for the time being in force thereunder shall also apply to farcy.

3. Where a Local Authority is authorized by the Privy Council to make regulations for the purpose of preventing the spreading of glanders and farcy, or either of them, the Local Authority may make regulations for the following purposes, or any of

of any field, stable, shed, or other premises in Affairs.

which glanders or farcy has been found to exist, of any horse that is or has been affected with glanders or farcy, or that has been in the same field, stable, shed, or other premises with or in contact with any horse affected with glanders or farcy.
